Dr Sanjay Chaturvedi is Professor of Political Science at the Centre for the Study of Geopolitics, and Honorary Director, Centre for the Study of Mid-West and Central Asia, Panjab University, Chandigarh, India. He specializes in the theory and practices of geopolitics; with special reference to Polar Regions and the Indian Ocean Region. His current area of research is geopolitics of climate change.

Chaturvedi was a Visiting Senior Research Fellow at the ISEAS–Yusof Ishak Institute (formerly Institute of Southeast Asian Studies), Singapore from 2010 to 2012. He is a recipient of several other visiting professorships and fellowships abroad including Curtin University, Australia; University of Wurzburg, Germany; India-China Institute, The New School, USA; University of Adelaide, Australia; University of Cambridge, England; University of Durham, U.K.; Columbia University Institute for Scholars, Paris; Faculty of Law, University of Sydney, Australia; Ben Gurion University of the Negev, Israel; and Henry L. Stimson Centre, Washington, D.C., USA.

Chaturvedi has been a member of the Steering Committee of International Geographical Union (IGU) Commission on Political Geography (2004–2012) and Co-Chair of Research Committee 15 (RC 15) on Political and Cultural Geography of International Political Science Association (IPSA): 2006–2012. He serves on the international editorial board of *Geopolitics* (Routledge) and *Co-operation and Conflict* (Sage). He is the founding Vice-Chairman of Indian Ocean Research Group (IORG) and co-editor of its flagship journal, *Journal of Indian Ocean Region* (Routledge). He is also the Regional Editor of *The Polar Journal* (Routledge) and a member of the international advisory board of *The Journal of Borderland Studies* (Routledge).

Chaturvedi is the author of *Polar Regions: A Political Geography* (John Wiley & Sons, 1994) and co-author of *Partitions: Reshaping Minds and States* (Routledge, 2005, 2015). He is the co-editor of *Euro-Asia at the Crossroads: Geopolitics, Identities and Discourse* (Shipra Publications, 2011); *Fisheries Exploitation in the Indian Ocean Region: Threats and Opportunities* (ISEAS, 2009); *State of Justice in India: Marginalities and Justice* (Sage, 2009) *Geopolitical Orientations Regionalism, and Security in the Indian Ocean* (Routledge Revivals, 2015); *Energy Security and the Indian Ocean Region* (Routledge Revivals, 2015); *The Security of Sea Lanes of Communication in the Indian Ocean Region* (Routledge Revivals, 2015). His research has been published in several peer-review journals including *Third World Quarterly*, *The Polar Journal*, *Australian Journal of Political Science*, *Cooperation and Conflict*, *Geopolitics*, *Journal of the Indian Ocean Region*, *Ocean Year*, *Terra: Journal of Geographical Society of Finland*, and *Journal of Social and Economic Geography*.

A member of the Core Group of Experts on Antarctic and Southern Ocean set up by the Ministry of Earth Sciences, Government of India, Chaturvedi has served on the Indian delegation to the Antarctic Treaty Consultative Meetings since 2007. He has also been a Visiting Speaker at the National Defence College and Foreign Service Institute, New Delhi.

Dr Vijay Sakhuja is the Director of National Maritime Foundation, New Delhi. He is also Visiting Senior Research Fellow at the ISEAS–Yusof Ishak Institute (formerly Institute of Southeast Asian Studies), Singapore since 2006.

A former Indian Navy officer, Sakhuja served in the navy for over two decades in various capacities including commanding officer and staff positions in the Naval Headquarters. He received his PhD from the Jawaharlal Nehru University in New Delhi and also completed M Phil studies from the same university.

Sakhuja has been on the research faculty of various think-tanks in India: Director (Research), Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA); Senior Fellow at the Centre for Airpower Studies (CAPS) and Observer Research Foundation (ORF); Research Fellow at the Institute for Defence Studies and Analyses (IDSA) and United Service Institution of India (USI), all in New Delhi.

Sakhuja's research areas include politico-strategic developments in the Indo-Pacific region, climate change, Arctic security, and maritime and naval developments. He has lectured at various Indian and international universities and military colleges.

Sakhuja is author of *Asian Maritime Power in the 21st Century: Strategic Transactions – China, India and Southeast Asia* and *Confidence Building from the Sea: An Indian Initiative*. He is editor of *India Vietnam Strategic Partnership: Exploring Vistas for Expanded Cooperation* and *Reinvigorating IOR-ARC*. He is also co-editor of twenty books including *India-Myanmar: Developing Engagements; Indo Pacific Region – Political and Strategic Prospects; India Poland Relations: Vistas for Cooperation in the 21st Century; India and ASEAN: Vision for Partnership and Prosperity; India and Russia: Deepening the Strategic Partnership; India and EU: Time to Go Strategic?; India and ASEAN: Partners for Peace, Progress and Stability; Fisheries Exploitation in the Indian Ocean: Threats and Opportunities; and Nagapattinam to Suvarnadwipa: Reflections on Chola Naval Expeditions to Southeast Asia*. Sakhuja has published a number of articles in Indian and international journals and chapter in edited books.
