Dato' Dr **OOI Kee Beng** is Executive Director of Penang Institute, before which he was Deputy Director of ISEAS – Yusof Ishak Institute (2011–17). He is founder-editor of the popular magazine *Penang Monthly*, and the policy briefs *ISSUES* (at Penang Institute) and *ISEAS Perspective* (at ISEAS). He is also the long-time editor of *Trends in Southeast Asia* (at ISEAS), and a regular columnist for *The Edge Malaysia*.
