In 1983 he was appointed Secretary General of the Central Governing Board (DPP) of Golkar. He was a minister in three different cabinets. Under President Soeharto, Sarwono became the

Minister of State for Administrative Reform before moving to take on the Environment portfolio. In the era of *Reformasi*, he was appointed as the Minister of Fishery and Maritime Affairs under President Abdurrahman Wahid. He was subsequently elected as a member of the Regional Representative Council (DPD) representing Jakarta.
