George Lane (Ph.D., University of London) teaches medieval Middle Eastern History at the School of Oriental and African Studies, London University. He is the author of *Early Mongol Rule in Thirteenth-Century Iran: A Persian Renaissance* (2003), *Daily Life in the Mongol Empire* (2006), and other works on the Mongols in Iran.

John Chaffee (Ph.D., University of Chicago) is Distinguished Service Professor and directs the Institute for Asia and Asian Diaspora at Binghamton University. He has written *The Thorny Gates of Learning in Sung China: A Social History of Examinations* (1985) and *Branches of Heaven: A History of the Imperial Clan of Sung China* (1999) and is writing a book about the Muslim maritime merchant communities from the Tang to the early Ming dynasties.

Ma Juan (Ph.D., Nanjing University) is Associate Professor of History at Lanzhou University and has written numerous articles on Islam and Muslims during the Yuan Dynasty.

Angela Schottenhammer (Ph.D., Würzburg University) is Professor of Chinese History at Ghent University, Belgium, and adjunct professor at the History Department, McGill University, Canada. She has been Professor of Chinese History at the Centro de Estudios de Asia y África, El Colegio de México, Munich University and Marburg University, Germany. She is author of *The Emporium of the World: Maritime Quanzhou* (2001), editor of *Crossroads - Studies on the History of Exchange Relations in the East Asian World and East Asian Maritime History* and has widely published in her fields of research.

Nancy Schatzman Steinhardt (Ph.D., Harvard University) is Professor of East Asian Art and Curator of Chinese Art at the University of Pennsylvania. She is the author or editor of *Chinese Traditional*

Architecture (1984), *Chinese Imperial City Planning* (1990), *Liao Architecture* (1997), *Chinese Architecture* (2003), and more than seventy articles.

Hyunhee Park (Ph.D., Yale University) received a B.A. degree in Asian and Western History at Seoul National University. On a fellowship from the Israeli government, she studied in the Department of East Asian Studies at the Hebrew University, where she earned an M. A. degree. She is currently Assistant Professor of History at John Jay College of the City University of New York.

Ralph Kauz (Ph.D., University of Munich) is Professor of Chinese History at the University of Bonn and has written *Politik und Handel zwischen Ming und Timuriden* (2005) among other books and articles on the Yuan and Ming dynasties.

Liu Yingsheng (Ph.D., Chinese Academy of Social Sciences) is Professor of History and Director of the Institute of Asian Studies at Nanjing University. He is Chair of the Chinese National Society of Yuan History and has been Visiting Professor at the School of Oriental and African Studies (London University), Lisbon University, and Hebrew University. He has published extensively on the history of the Yuan Dynasty.

Michael Brose (Ph.D., University of Pennsylvania) is Associate Professor and Chair of the History Department at the University of Wyoming. He has published *Masters and Subjects: Uyghurs in the Mongol Empire* (2007) and numerous articles on foreigners in the Yuan and Ming China. His research interests include the history of the Chinese Muslim community in Yunnan.

Morris Rossabi (Ph.D., Columbia University) is Distinguished Professor of History at City University of New York and Adjunct Professor at Columbia University. He has written *Khubilai Khan* (1988), *Voyager from Xanadu* (1992), and *Modern Mongolia* (2005) and has collaborated on exhibitions on Yuan Dynasty and Mongol art at several museums in the U.S.
