Robert H. Taylor was formerly Professor of Politics and Pro-Director of the School of Oriental and African Studies (London) and subsequently Vice-Chancellor of the University of Buckingham. Earlier he taught at Wilberforce and Sydney universities. More recently, he was a Visiting Professor at City University of Hong Kong and Visiting Professorial Fellow at the Institute of Southeast Asian Studies where this volume was drafted. Educated at Ohio University, Antioch College, and Cornell University, he is the author of a number of scholarly publications on Myanmar and Southeast Asia, including The State in Myanmar (2009; in Burmese, 2014), The State in Burma (1987; in Thai, 2006), Marxism and Resistance in Burma, 1942-1945 (1984), and The Foreign and Domestic Consequences of the KMT Intervention in Burma (1973). A contributor to In Search of Southeast Asia: A Modern History (1987) and The Emergence of Southeast Asia: A New History (2005), he edited, among other works, Dr. Maung Maung: Gentlemen, Scholar, Patriot (2008) and The Politics of Elections in Southeast Asia (1996). In addition to his academic career, Professor Taylor has worked as a consultant to the oil and gas industry and served as a lay member of the United Kingdom Immigration and Asylum Tribunal. A frequent traveller to Myanmar since 1975, he lived there for extended periods in the 1970s, 1980s and since 2000.
