PRIMARY SOURCES

For Mr Rajaratnam's private papers, the main sources are the ISEAS – Yusof Ishak Institute Library and the National Archives of Singapore (NAS). Some of his papers and files that are currently in my keeping with the permission of Dr V.K. Pillay, to whom Mr Rajaratnam had bequeathed his Chancery Lane house, will also be deposited with these two organisations.

As for government papers, the main sources are the NAS and Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) Archives.

Diplomatic despatches, sourced from the National Archives of the United Kingdom (UK), Australia, New Zealand and the United States, were mainly accessed at the NAS, although I also earlier studied some documents in the National Archives UK at Kew. In recent years, some from the UK, Australia and the US have also been declassified and released online.

Oral history interviews of those cited in this volume are by the Oral History Centre, NAS.

Most of Mr Rajaratnam's public speeches can be found in the NAS, MFA library and ISEAS – Yusof Ishak Institute Library. Another useful source are the files of newspaper clippings compiled by Mr Rajaratnam throughout his working life.
