ELIGIBILITY

- * Ph.D. holders or Ph.D. candidates and equivalents (preferably researchers below 45) who demonstrate research competence and have an interest in one or more of the following suggested fields of study:
 - A. ASEAN in Domestic and Sub-Regional Dimensions
 - B. ASEAN in Global Dimensions
 - C. Southeast Asia/ASEAN-Japan Relations
- * Proficiency in English (Proficiency in Japanese is desirable but not required)
- * Citizens of ASEAN countries
- * Researchers who have not received any grants of fellowship in Japan are given priority.

Applicants should submit the following documents to JIIA

- * A completed JIIA Fellowship application form
- * An original research proposal on a topic in the suggested fields of study, maximum 10 pages (typewritten in double-space)
- * A research paper on a theme chosen in the suggested fields of study. Previous work is acceptable. It should be typewritten in double-space 15-30 pages.
- * All applications should be submitted by January 31, 1996.

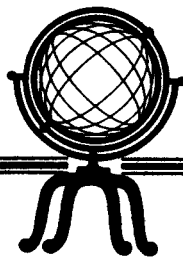
