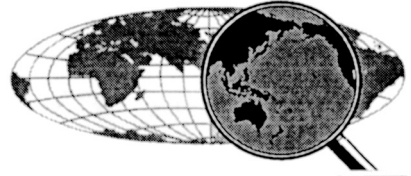
**Announcing a major international conference
