III Workshop on the Seafarer in the ASEAN Region

“Seafarers in the ASEAN Region” is a joint project between ISEAS and the Dalhousie Ocean Studies Programme (DOSP) under the overall co-ordination of the Southeast Asian Project on the Law of the Sea (SEAPOL) at

the Institute of Asian Studies, Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok. The project examines the development of the seafaring industry of the ASEAN countries (except Brunei) including the training, wages, working conditions, and welfare of seafarers. IV Symposium on ASEAN Small and Medium Business Improvement

Organized by the Institute of Southeast Asian Studies in co-operation with the Industrial Management Co. Ltd., Thailand, this symposium was held in Bangkok on 14–15 April 1987. It brought together senior public and private sector officials from the ASEAN region, representatives of international organizations and foundations, and researchers — all identified by a familiarity with, and concern for, the problems and prospects of small and medium businesses (SMBs) in the region.

Findings and recommendations from the three phases of the ASEAN Small and Medium Business Improvement Project coordinated by ISEAS were presented by heads of the participating country research teams, and formed the basis of discussion. There were discussion sessions after every country presentation, and a concluding session that focused on intra-ASEAN co-operation for the improvement of SMBs.
