Seiji Naya currently serves as a Distinguished Visiting Senior Fellow at the East-West Center and Emeritus Professor at the University of Hawaii.

He has worked in the field of international economics and Asian Development for over 40 years. He has served as Rockefeller Foundation Visiting Professor at Thammasat University in Thailand; as Chief Economist of the Asian Development Bank (ADB); Professor of Economics at the University of Hawaii, in the cabinet of the State of Hawaii. His publications include articles in *American Economic Review* and *Economic Development and Cultural Change*. His research on ASEAN has included the *US-ASEAN Initiative* in 1989, where he served as main author, and his latest publications include the *Asian Development Experience*, published by the ADB in 2002. He has also been a visiting professor/scholar at many universities and research institutes throughout the world, including Kobe University, the Monterey Institute of International Studies, the Institute of Southeast Asian Studies, and the Institut d'Études Politiques (Paris), as well as having been a Pew Fellow at Harvard University (1994–95). He is on the editorial boards of the *Journal of Asian Economics* and *World Development*.
